Facilities purpose built for animals, such as our expanded veterinary clinic and new adoption centre, will set a new benchmark for animal care in South Australia. A visionary new education centre offering services for the community will also support our long-term goal of reducing and preventing animal cruelty.

We want to stay in the southern region where we have enjoyed enormous support for more than 30 years, particularly from our significant team of volunteers.

We also enjoy strong connections with local community groups in the southern region, which we want to maintain and grow further.
