Carole is a vet who lives with two dogs, three cats and four goats.

Black Saturday bushfires brought profound tragedy into her life, but the love she shared with a kitten orphaned by the fire helped her to keep going . . .

Animals make life complete. They have given me unconditional love, innumerable hours of happiness, guidance on my path in life, and the courage to continue it.

My first pet was a very gentle tabby cat called Velvet. One day when I was four years old, I was trying to help another child to read a book. Several of the other children were not happy that I could already read, and were very unkind.

My mother was called to collect me and it was Velvet I confided in that day and whose purring comforted me. Unconditional love! I made a promise to her then that I would become a vet, so I could help and care for animals as she had cared for me. I kept my promise.

I lost my husband, my pets, and my home in the Black Saturday bushfires.

I was at the Diamond Creek relief centre the day after, still numb from the shock, when a social worker asked me if I could help with a small kitten whose mother and siblings had died in the fire. This little 300 gram fellow had been found wandering though the ashes.

I called him Phoenix. And we helped to heal each other. He gave me a reason, and the courage, to carry on. Our bond is extremely strong.

One year to the day after Black Saturday, I returned home from work to find a bunch of beautiful white tulips on my doorstep. They were my husband's favourite flower.

The card with the flowers read: "With love from your RSPCA family." How they found white tulips in February, I will never know, but I will never forget the kindness I felt in that moment.

My love of animals is what defines me – the reason and the purpose in my life."

Animals cannot prevent the cruelty they suffer at the hands of people. They need an army of animal lovers to speak for them, protect them, and rescue them from harm.

I've been a vet all my life, and I can say with some confidence that the only organisation with the expertise, the credibility and above all, the love, to be able to do that, is the RSPCA.

For this, and for many other reasons, I've included a percentage of my estate to RSPCA in my Will.

How to leave animals a better world, with a gift to RSPCA South Australia in your Will . . .

After making provisions for those you want to provide for, you can help the animals you love so much through including a gift in your Will to RSPCA South Australia. No matter the size of your gift, it will help to leave animals a better world.

Step 1. Think about the type of gift you'd like to leave.


There are several different types of gift you can leave to a charity in your Will. We've explained a little more about the two most common on the next page. Percentage and residuary gifts are especially effective at sharing your estate amongst people and causes you care about, and maximising the impact of your legacy to RSPCA South Australia.

Step 2. Talk to your solicitor.

Your solicitor can draw up a Will for you, or update your existing Will to include a gift to RSPCA South Australia. It's very easy to do. We've also included some suggested wording on the next page, which might help your solicitor with the legal wording to make sure that you include RSPCA South Australia properly.

Step 3. Talk to your family.

Of course, it's your Will, and your choice to tell whomever you wish about its contents. However, sharing the fact that you've included a gift to RSPCA South Australia in your Will with your family and friends means there'll be 'no surprises' when the time comes.



The two main types of gifts our supporters leave

1. Percentage of your estate.

You simply state in your Will what percentage of your estate you would like to be left to RSPCA South Australia. Some people leave just a few percent. Some leave everything to animals. The average is around 7%.

Suggested wording for your Will:

I give to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (South Australia) Incorporated, of 16 Nelson Street, Stepney SA 5069 (ABN 60 740 135 753): XX per cent of my estate for the general purposes of the RSPCA. I declare the receipt of the RSPCA will be sufficient discharge for my Trustees.

2. Residue of your estate.

After gifts to others have been taken care of, and all costs have been dealt with, the residue of your estate – everything that remains – is then left to RSPCA South Australia to protect animals long into the future.

Suggested wording for your Will:

I give to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (South Australia) Incorporated, of 16 Nelson Street, Stepney SA 5069 (ABN 60 740 135 753): the residue of my estate for the general purposes of the RSPCA. I declare the receipt of the RSPCA will be sufficient discharge for my Trustees.

Provide us with information about your pets, to ensure we have all we need to care for them and find them a new loving family when the time comes.


Step 3
