#### At work in South Australia since 1875

Established in London in 1824, RSPCA was recognised as the first organisation in the world to concentrate solely on animal welfare issues. RSPCA South Australia was formed in 1875 to protect innocent animals against cruelty and provide treatment and care for thousands of sick, injured and abandoned animals.

As a not for profit charity organisation, RSPCA SA relies on the support and generosity of the public to maintain our authoritative presence in the community and continue providing essential animal welfare services. A strong membership base is vital to our quest to improve animal welfare laws and attitudes towards animals.

#### **RSPCA SA INSPECTORATE**

Our inspectors are our uniformed representatives who are trained in the area of animal welfare and the enforcement of the Animal Welfare Act 1985. Inspectors police the entire state of South Australia, investigate reports of animal cruelty and also assist with animal rescues.

The work of the inspectorate is vital in protecting animals against cruelty and neglect. Your membership and ongoing support will be a valuable contribution towards the significant cost of providing this service.

#### **REPORTING ANIMAL CRUELTY**

We take all reports of animal cruelty seriously. Reports of animal mistreatment within both the metropolitan and rural areas can be made by phone on 1300 477 722 or via our website. All reports are confidential and will be passed on to one of our inspectors to investigate. Please note we cannot act on third party reports.

#### **24 HOUR RESCUE SERVICE**

Our Rescue Team operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week rescuing sick, injured and stray animals. If you see an injured or distressed animal, or one that is in imminent danger, please call 1300 477 722.

For treatment of your own animals, please contact your local veterinarian. To report information about uninjured stray animals, contact your local council.

#### **RSPCA SA ANIMAL SHELTERS**

Each year, the dedicated staff and volunteers at the O'Halloran Hill, Port Lincoln and Whyalla animal shelters work tirelessly to find loving new homes and care for thousands of animals.

Our shelters offer a range of services and serve as refuges for lost, abandoned and stray animals from local councils and the public, as well as adoption centres for companion animals and pocket pets.

All animals adopted from us have undergone health and behavioural checks, are vaccinated, wormed, microchipped and desexed.

Animals that are waiting to be reclaimed by their owner, awaiting their new forever homes or animals that are held as the subject of a prosecution, are cared for by compassionate staff and volunteers. #### THE FIVE FREEDOMS

The five freedoms form a logical and comprehensive framework to assess the welfare of any animal. The five freedoms also provide clear steps and compromises necessary to safeguard or improve the welfare of an animal.

- 1. Freedom from hunger and thirst: by ready access to fresh water and a diet to maintain full health and vigour.
- **2. Freedom from discomfort:** by providing an appropriate environment including shelter and a comfortable resting area.
- **3.** Freedom from pain, injury or disease: by prevention through rapid diagnosis and treatment.
- Freedom to express normal behaviour: by providing sufficient space, proper facilities and company of the animal's own kind.
- Freedom from fear and distress: by ensuring conditions and treatment which avoid mental suffering.
